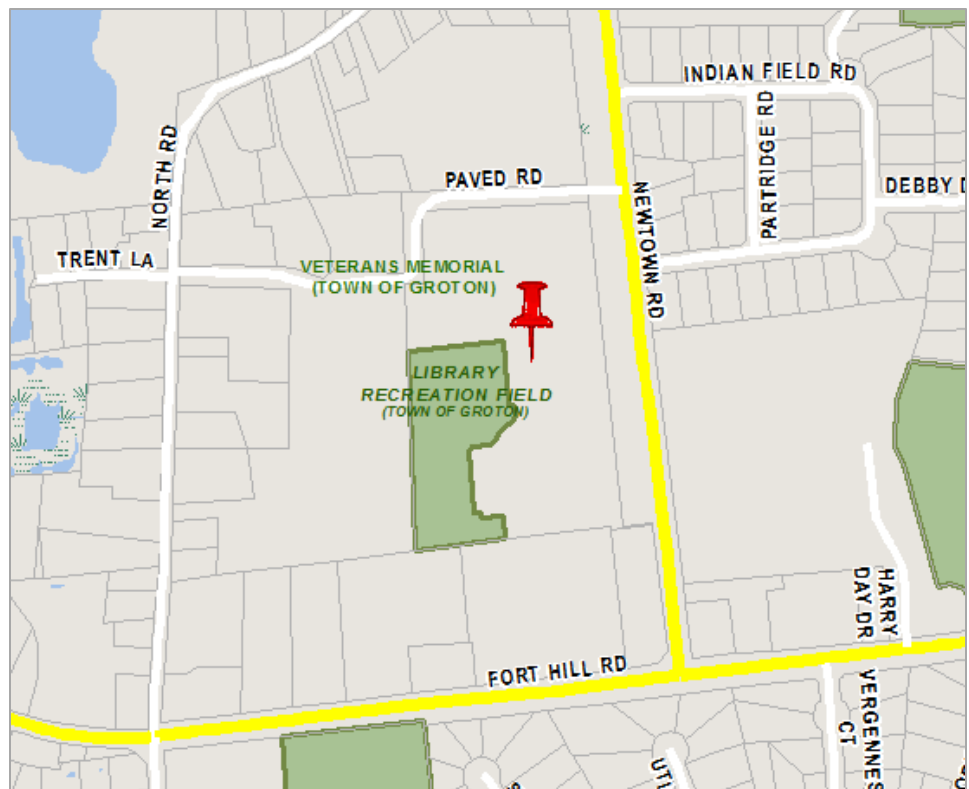

## DIRECTIONS:

Memorial Plaza between Groton Public Library and Senior Center

From Groton: Route 1 to Route 117. North on Route 117, Enter the Groton Public Library parking lot on the left.

From Mystic: / I-95 N & S: I-95 to Exit 88, south on Route 117 to the light at Indian Field Dr. Enter the Groton Public Library parking lot on the right.



## Park Information:

This plaza includes three large, light grey granite stones dedicated May 26, 1984. The three stones are connected by two granite benches to form a continuous whole. The left Stone is inscribed World War I - World War II, and the right stone is inscribed Korea – Vietnam. The central stone is inscribed “The citizens of Groton, Connecticut have not forgotten the courage, valor, and sacrifice of their veterans of all wars.”

A fourth stone was dedicated November 16, 1997, as the Twentieth Century memorial stone. This stone has a carved inscription that reads “Dedicated by the Town of Groton in honor and memory of those who lost heir lives in the service of our nation.” It shows the insignia of six Armed Services, including the Merchant Marine, without captions. It lists the names of 67 persons who died in World War I, World War II, Korea, and Vietnam.
